Over the last month, LCF was involved in several community initiatives, including:

- 1. The Imani Clinic: A UC Davis student run clinic in the Oak Park Area. LCF participated alongside other health care providers to provide donated medical equipment to those in need.
- 2. Amputee Support Group: LCF was invited to speak at the local Sacramento chapter of the Amputee Support Group where we were able to share LCF with amputees and their families and the services we offer through the organization.
- 3. Amputee Soccer Clinic: LCF participated in an amputee soccer event in Los Angeles which was hosted by Angel City Sports. This was a fun-filled event for individuals to learn about amputee soccer and other adaptive sports.

Educational Goal

LCF is seeking to create and distribute Limb Care Kits (LCKs) to those experiencing homelessness next year. The LCKs will contain an assortment of supplies with the purpose of preventing injury and preserving one's limbs. These supplies will include educational material on early signs of injury, skin care products, first aid supplies, socks, and much more

Advocacy and Representation Goal

Next year, our goal is to begin the recruiting process to form our board of directors. We will be looking for dedicated members from diverse backgrounds who want to be involved in the decision and planning process of the organization for years to come.
